Twenty years ago, the first COBA Newsletter was published by the then Editor – Sydney Ellis – and I am pleased to say that with his help, I am able to take on this role. They all went about contacting and drawing old boys of Campion together to form the association. Many of our senior members will recall that very soon an interim committee was formed with the following members: Melly, Jude and Alister D'Rozario, Sydney Ellis, Ronnie Fernandez, Chico Gomez, Joe Hickman, Joe Lopez, Anto Patterson, Rex Rodrigues, Robbie Starr and Claude Fernandez who was on holidays from the UK. They met in Joe Lopez's house in at 3.00pm on the 14th Nov 1999. From here the first Committee was formed with Cedric D'Rozario being the first President, Des Hickman the Vice President, Alister D'Rozario the Secretary, Marius Menaud as Assistant Secretary, Clive Pereira the Treasurer and Royden Joseph the Assistant Treasurer. Along with the above Executive Committee there were six committee members: Joe Lopez, Sydney Ellis, Christopher Gomez, Anto Patterson, Joe Hickman and Robbie Starr.

The club's constitution was formulated by Sydney Ellis and Cedric D'Rozario as President got his accountant to be the club's Auditor. With the club's foundations set, Social Convener Anto Patterson and the committee set about organizing COBA's first events with zest. Over the years there were other extremely passionate members who took on the reins. The association has grown through the years, its progress keenly followed by its founders and members. The current committee comprises of both the young and the young at heart, which gives COBA Australia a good blend to continue for another twenty years and beyond. I am proud to be a part of COBA Australia and will endeavour to deliver my duties as Newsletter Editor to the best of my abilities.

I request the younger generation of Campionites reading this to continue the good work to expand our network and ensure our continuity.

Member Profiles

Robert Starr: To everyone who's known COBA over the years, Robbie is a familiar face. A member since the formation of the association, he has been tireless in his support; serving as COBA's Treasurer for 8 years between 2006 and 2014.

Robbie and his brothers Ronald and Christopher were all in the Campion boarding. Mysore was home, where their father worked with the Indian Railways.

During his years at Campion, Robbie represented the school in cricket. He also managed to get expelled from school by Fr. Macedo for 3 days for jumping over the hostel wall – but swears it was his identical twin Ronald. Through the school-years, there were several such cases of mistaken-identity for the twins and they both received their share of caning from Fr. Thambi.

After finishing with Campion, (Class of '72) Robbie worked as an apprentice in Ashok Leyland. He migrated to Australia in December 1990 and has been working for Yarra Trams for the last 28 years. Robbie, his wife Anne and daughters Cassandra and Rachael live in South Oakleigh in the south-eastern suburbs of Melbourne.



Glen Johnson: Glen's parents packed him off to the Campion boarding at the age of 13, having decided that Campion was a better school than the ones in Madras. Being a lone student from Madras at that time was tough and he soon found himself being pulled down the stairs and "kotooed" on the head at night. But like all boarders, with hockey and cricket, he soon made friends. With the help of a band of illustrious teachers he passed out of Campion (Class of '65) with flying colours, achieving distinctions in many subjects.

Migrating to Australia in the early '70s, Glen pursued a career in the textile industry as a high-level management executive. He's been a member of Toastmasters International for many years and volunteers in aid-agencies providing assistance to the needy across Melbourne. Memories of my NCC days at Campion - Royston Edwards (Class of '68)

I wish to share with you the memories of my years in the NCC (National Cadet Corps) at Campion. We had all 3 branches of the NCC at Campion namely the sea cadets, the air wing and of course, the army. The head of the sea-wing was Fr. Thambi; the air-wing led by Mr. Dennison and the army by Mr. Gnanakannu.

As a youngster, I looked up to the senior boys who were in the NCC as they attended parades; went on camps; took pride in their uniforms, shining the boots, the brass-buckle on the belt and badge on the beret. It was also spectacular to see all the 3 wings performing the march past and drills with such discipline and precession.

When it was my turn, I realised there were some perks to joining the NCC. It offered an escape from the drudgery of the study-hall and classes to attend parades and camps. One could also be selected to represent the school in the republic day parade which took place in Delhi.

For a boarder, it was a good break to eat the poratta and serva (mutton-korma minus the mutton!) after the parade. The brown canvas sand-shoes (keddies) came in handy for playing hockey. As I was in the air-wing I also enjoyed building model aeroplanes with the balsa wood kit and flying them on the playground.

Many of the Campion boys who were in the NCC later joined the armed forces and rose to high ranks. I remember Ashley Bastian, Everad D'Silva and Carlton D'Netto joined the Indian army; Austin Jackson was in the Airforce. I am sure there are many more Campion boys who joined the Forces. Herman Johnson comes to mind who also served in the Indian army and did a stint on the front. They all got their foundation in the NCC. I only got to the rank of sergeant with 3 stripes on the arm and was only a tin soldier.

I shall close this article with the command of:
Lamba dynay, Chota baynay, ek line may kadaw
Theen line bun, thace chull.

Which translates in English as:

Tallest to the right, shortest to the left, form a straight line, then make a quick march to form a group in lines of three.

I end with a salute to all the boys from Campion who served in the Indian forces.

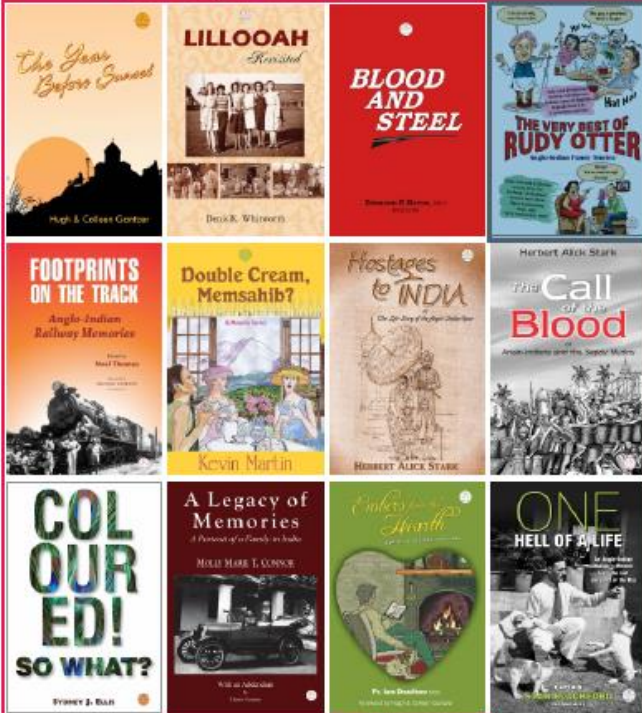
